



Dear Invitation Homes Resident,

As you may be aware, there's a chance some or all of the Florida Regional Offices may be impacted by Hurricane Irma this weekend. **Preliminary forecasts show the storm's wind and rain could impact the state of Florida. Irma is a very dangerous Category 5 hurricane with maximum wind speeds of 175 mph. This storm must be taken seriously. Heavy rains may result in significant flooding.**

Our primary concern is the safety of you and your family and secondarily we have a shared interest in protecting your home. Please review the following documents:

Please stay informed. Several websites are available to monitor storm warnings, including the National Hurricane Center: <http://www.nhc.noaa.gov>. **Follow the instructions provided by your local city, state and county agencies, including evacuation orders.**

Maintaining renter's insurance is critical to cover your personal property in the event of damage occurring from a storm or other causes.

Should your home contain **hurricane shutters**, those shutters were inherited when we acquired the home (purchased by a prior owner), and therefore we cannot confirm if the shutters cover the entire house nor confirm the shutters are code compliant and safe. Do not rely on these shutters to protect you, your family or your assets. Any existing shutters at the house cannot be installed by Invitation Homes. Please use good judgment and discretion.

If your home is part of a Homeowners Association (HOA), please be sure you follow any community specific instructions. This may include, but is not limited to, gate access issues due to electrical or mechanical reasons, evacuation directions, etc.

Again, for your safety, we encourage you to take seriously any steps that local or other (county/state/federal) governmental agencies recommend to help you prepare for such an event, including evacuation orders. Please stay safe!
